

Householder validation checklist

These notes provide a checklist to determine what information the Council requires to be submitted with your application. If the information that is required is not included with your application, then it will be made invalid and we will not register or process it. In this case, we will try and speak directly to you stating what additional information is required and how this can be supplied.

Please supply one copy of each document and plan. Application forms can be obtained from the Council offices or website www.cotswold.gov.uk. Alternatively online applications can be made via the Planning Portal: www.planningportal.gov.uk

Completed Application Form Including a signed ownership certificate (either A, B, C or D).	
Correct Fee where necessary: CDC web-site Planning Fees page Planning Portal Fee Calculator	
 Location Plan: Ordnance survey based, at a scale of 1:1250 or 1:2500. Up-to-date, with north marked, and sufficient to locate the site. Red outline to application site. Blue outline to other land owned by the applicant. The plan must cover a large enough area to enable the location to be easily found. 	
 Existing and Proposed Block Plan: at a scale of at least 1:500. The existing plan must show the existing structures, boundary treatments, trees etc on the site The proposed plan must show the proposed development in relation to the site boundaries and other existing buildings on the site. Any trees or public rights of way affected by the development should be shown Any new boundary walls or fencing proposed as part of the development Parking areas 	
 Existing and Proposed Elevations at a scale of 1:50 or 1:100. Show the proposal in relation to the existing site and adjacent buildings. All sides of the proposal must be shown and labelled. 	
 Existing and Proposed Floor Plans at a scale of 1:50 or 1:100. These should highlight any walls to be demolished and show the uses of the rooms 	
 Roof Plans at a scale of 1:50 or 1:100. Showing the shape of the roof and any materials, roof lights, flues etc. 	
Site Sections, Finished Floor and Site Levels at a scale of 1:50 or 1:100.	



Where a proposal involves a change in ground levels the plans should show the existing and finished levels and the relationship to neighbouring development. Levels should be related to a fixed point datum. The impact of any significant change in levels should be illustrated by sectional drawings which show both existing and proposed levels. Gradients and retaining structures should be shown together with information regarding drainage. If significant quantities of material are to be imported or exported, details should be provided of source / destination, nature of material and volume.

Air Quality Assessment If you are proposing the installation of a biomass boiler please complete the following form. Further information regarding air quality can be found here.	
Biodiversity Survey and Report Required if an important wildlife site, habitat, natural feature or species could be affected. Advice is available from the Council website: When is an assessment required? and What information is needed?	
Daylight/Sunlight Assessment Required to show the impact of the proposal on neighbouring gardens and rooms if the proposal is: Greater than single storey in height or A single storey proposal that is likely to have significant impact.	
Flood Risk Assessment/Drainage Strategy Required where the site is located within a flood risk zone 2 or 3. Existing and proposed floor levels or other flood proofing details may be required. Information on flood risk zones is available at Environment Agency Advice .	
Heritage / Historic Environment Statement Required where the proposals may affect a designated or undesignated heritage asset, including archaeologically sensitive areas (e.g. Scheduled Monuments); historic buildings (e.g. listed buildings) or historic landscapes (e.g. registered parks). For further information – Heritage / Historic Environment Statement	
Tree Survey/Arboricultural Impact assessment in accordance with the guidance in British Standard 5837 Trees in relation to design, demolition and construction – Recommendations	
 Required for any proposal involving development (including hard surfacing, structures, site set up, utilities, excavations or changes in ground level) within 15m of any tree protected by a Tree Preservation Order or within 10m of any other tree that measures either 5m or over in height or is 250mm or more in trunk diameter 	



(trunk measured at 1.5m above ground level) This information should be prepared by a qualified Arboriculturist.
