What's on your doorstep?

Explore local funding to see if there are any Gloucestershire County Council or District Council grants available which could fit a community growing project. These might be through 'Greener Gloucestershire' or the 'Shared Prosperity Funds'. Other local funding sources might be 'Green and Blue Social Prescribing initiatives', the Cotswold National Landscape's FIPL grants. Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust, or local funders, such as Gloucestershire Funders, Thirty Percy, The Barnwood Trust, or Ernest Cook Trust. Local companies or businesses near your project may have community schemes, or be able to help with resources or volunteers.

What else is out there?

National funding sources - National Lottery, People's Postcode Lottery, Groundwork, Hubbub, NAGT, CLA, Naturesave Trust, Kew Grow Wild, National Garden Scheme and for help with funding advice, check Sustain, Incredible Edible and Coronation Gardens.

How could we be more financially sustainable?

Also worth considering are Fundraising, Membership or Social Enterprise models. Some projects host workshops, events, and corporate volunteering, or run membership fee models, and some have even worked with property developers via BNG requirements (Global Generation).
